#### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

There is no better way for us to honour our Heavenly Queen during her month of May, or indeed any time, than by praying the Holy Rosary. One of my great heroes, Archbishop Fulton Sheen wrote a famous book on Our Lady entitled, *The World's First Love*, in that book he offers us five reasons why we should pray the Rosary:

Firstly, growth in the knowledge of God. In his book, he wrote, "If you wish to convert anyone to the fullness of the knowledge of Our Lord and of His Mystical Body, then teach him the rosary." The Rosary offers a meditative prayer on the mysteries of Christ's life as experienced in the Gospels. It invites us to better know and love Christ by entering into meditations on His birth, daily life, Passion, death, and Resurrection.

Secondly, an increase in concentration. The Rosary provides us not only with the gift of meditative prayer but also an opportunity for vocal prayer. Sheen wrote, "Concentration is impossible when the mind is troubled; thoughts run helter-skelter; a thousand and one images flood across the mind; distracted and wayward, the spiritual seems a long way off. The rosary is the best therapy for these distraught, unhappy, fearful, and frustrated souls, precisely because it involves the simultaneous use of three powers: the physical, the vocal, and the spiritual, and in that order."

Thirdly, help in overcome worries and anxieties. Very few people live free from anxieties and worries. Sheen wrote: "No normal mind yet has been overcome by worries or fears who was faithful to the rosary. You will be surprised how you can climb out of your worries, bead by bead, up to the very throne of the Heart of Love itself." Through the Rosary, Jesus can speak into our hearts, saying the words He spoke to Martha: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about so many things, but one thing is necessary".

Fourthly, it is an outward and inward sign of our love of God. For Sheen, repetition emphasized a point and was not simply done mindlessly. He wrote, "The mind is infinitely variable in its language, but the heart is not. The heart of a man, in the face of a woman he loves, is too poor to translate the infinity of his affection into a different word. So the heart takes one expression, 'I love you,' and in saying it over and over again, it never repeats. That is what we do when we say the Rosary—we are saying to God, the Trinity, to the Incarnate Saviour, to the Blessed Mother: 'I love you, I love you, I love you.'" How often do we tell God that we love Him?

Finally, it allows us to sanctify the entire day. Sheen wrote that the Rosary could help us do this: "All the idle moments of one's life can be sanctified, thanks to the Rosary. As we walk the streets, we pray with the Rosary hidden in our hand or in our pocket. . . . All these moments can be sanctified and made to serve inner peace, thanks to a prayer that enables one to pray at all times and under all circumstances." It only takes a few minutes to pray a single decade of the Rosary. We can say a decade while we drive to work, as we walk to the shops, as we vacuum the carpet, as we queue to get a coffee, etc. Through the Rosary, we can sanctify not only the best moments of our day, but also the idle and seemingly mundane ones as well.
