FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Just as June was dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus (all months of the year in the Church have a particular dedication) so July is traditionally dedicated to Our Lord's Precious Blood. It is a recognition of Jesus' sacrifice and how He spilled His blood for the salvation of the world. Furthermore, this blood is made present through the gift of the Eucharist and is something we consume at Mass, along under the appearance of bread and wine.

During the First Italian War for Independence in 1849, Pope Pius IX went into exile to Gaeta. He went there with Don Giovanni Merlini, the third superior general of the Fathers of the Most Precious Blood. While the war was still raging, Merlini suggested to Pope Pius IX that he create a universal feast to the Precious Blood to beg God's heavenly aid to end the war and bring peace to Rome. Pius IX subsequently made a statement on June 30, 1849 that he intended to create a feast in honour of the Precious Blood. The war soon ended and he returned to Rome shortly thereafter. On 10th August he made it official and proclaimed that the 1st Sunday in July would be dedicated to the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ and subsequently, Pope Pius X assigned 1st July as the fixed date of this celebration.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Saviour shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

Devotion to the Precious Blood is not a spiritual option, it is a spiritual obligation, and not only for priests, but for every follower of Christ. Devotion, as we know, is always made up of three elements: It is first- veneration, it is secondly- invocation, and it is thirdly- imitation. This veneration of the Precious Blood, which is the first element in our devotion means that we have a deep sensitivity to the awfulness of sin. Sin must be terrible. It must be the most dreadful thing in the universe. Why? Because it cost the living God in human form the shedding of His Blood. Secondly, we must learn to invoke the Precious Blood. There is nothing that has greater power or authority that the spilled blood of Christ and nothing can make our prayers as efficacious as calling upon and pleading the Precious Blood of the Lord. Finally we are all called to imitate the Precious Blood, some people, yes, by the shedding of their own blood as martyrs but for most of us this will mean the laying down of our lives and the emptying of ourselves in the service of others. Giving of ourselves generously, freely and without complaint.

Whenever we go to Mass and receive the Sacred Host, we are receiving not only the Body of Christ, but His Precious Blood too. Once the bread has been consecrated at Mass, it is transformed into the very Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Himself and is given to nourish and heal us.

During this month of July, remember to honour Our Lords Precious Blood and to pray each day:

O precious Blood of Jesus, infinite price paid for the redemption of sinful mankind. O Divine Blood, drink and cleanser of our souls, standing between us and the Father pleading for mercy. With all my heart I adore You, sweet Lord, and offer reparation for the insults, outrages and ingratitude, which You continuously receive from indifferent men. Grant, I beg, that I may worthily adore this price of my salvation and through its power be safeguarded from all evils of this present life so that I may rejoice in its fruits forever with You in the next. Through the same Christ our Lord.
