#### FROM YOUR PARISH PREIST

I was in school this week talking to some of our children about Baptism. We talked about the various signs and symbols associated with this Sacrament and especially about how the baby (or adult) is anointed with the sacred oil of Chrism as a reminder that they now share in the Lord's role as priest prophet, and king. So what does that mean?

As priest, Jesus sanctifies, that is to say, He re-establishes the lost link between divinity and humanity; as prophet, He speaks and embodies the divine truth; and as king, he leads us on the right path, giving guidance to the fallen world. You might say that, as priest, He is the life; as prophet, He is the truth and as king He is the way.

According to Catholic theology, baptism is much more than merely a symbolic sign of belonging to the Church. It is the means by which a person is incorporated into Christ, becoming a member of His mystical body. Baptism, accordingly, makes the baptised an *alter Christus*, another Christ. So what does this look like in practice? How does it show itself in the lives of ordinary believers?

A priest fosters holiness, precisely in the measure that he serves as a bridge between God and human beings. In ancient Roman times, the priest was described as a *pontifex*, bridge-builder, and this remains a valid description for us in the Christian context. Therefore baptised priests (that's you) are meant, first, to embody the harmony that God wants between Himself and those made in His image and likeness. You are to affect this through your own devotion to prayer, the sacraments, and the Mass.

What then does it mean for the average baptised person to be a prophet? A person is a prophet in the measure that he or she bears witness to the truth of God. G.K. Chesterton once wrote that that in this upside-down world of ours, "the prophet is the one who stands on his head so that he might see things aright." This is why prophets have always appeared a little insane. In fact, the Hebrew word for prophet, "*nabi*," has the overtone of 'madman'. To speak the truth in today's world is a dangerous endeavour. When all those around us, even family members, object to the Truth the Jesus has revealed, to make a stand and to hold fast to what is good, true and beautiful can leave us looking, in the eyes of the world, crazy. But it is what we have been baptised to do!

Finally, what does it mean for the ordinary Catholic to be a king? In the theological sense, a king is someone orders and directs a community toward God. We are all called to kingly leadership in our everyday lives. The example that we set to those around is key to the exercise of this ministry. We are called to be kings at home, at work and among our friends, remembering that a true king is always one who serves. For example, a Catholic parent directs their children toward the accomplishment of their God-given missions, educating them, shaping them interiorly, moulding their behaviour, disciplining their desires.

The key to the renewal of our broken society is a recovery of the deepest meaning of our baptism, to become priestly, prophetic, and kingly people. The people around us need Jesus. He is the way the truth and the life and there is no other. Reclaim the power of your baptism and save the world.
