### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

In the latest bizarre turn of events from the House of Commons, on Wednesday this week, during Prime Minister's Questions, Labour MP Tahir Ali asked Sir Keir Starmer if he would "commit to introducing measures to prohibit the desecration of all religious texts and the prophets of the Abrahamic religions." Effectivity, he was asking if the Prime Minster would bring forward laws to make blasphemy a criminal offence. Shockingly, rather than reply with a simple and outright "no", Sir Keir gave a somewhat mealymouthed response about condemning Islamophobia in all its forms and described the desecration of religious texts as "awful".

Now, to an extent he is correct, of course the last thing that we would ever wish to do is to insult the sincerely held beliefs of others. That sort of behaviour would not only be unchristian but also simply rude and the height of bad manners. To deliberately cause distress and give gratuitous offence to other people is always wrong. That being said, the notion of making such behaviour illegal is farcical. We need to have the necessary freedom to discuss religion openly and frankly and not to be hindered or silenced by a fear of what the state might think.

Jesus Christ is God, the Son of the Eternal Father, He is the way the Truth and the Life and there is no other. Now, presumably, to many people of other faiths, this statement is blasphemy, perhaps even offensive but it is nevertheless the truth and we cannot escape from that, it is the central belief of our religion. This sentiment can never and must never be criminalised not only for our sake, but the sake of people of other faiths who may wish to make similar truth claims about their own religions. And why wouldn't they? The Jews deny that Jesus Christ is the messiah and the Son of God and they are perfectly at liberty to say so. We cannot expect or force people of other faiths to believe the same things that we do, we do not live in a theocracy and nor should we. Freedom of religion is an essential human right.

What this question does raise for us as Catholics, however, is not the rights and wrongs of medieval style blasphemy laws aimed at protecting the quran, but rather our own relationship with the most Holy Name of Jesus. Blasphemy is absolutely not a crime, but it most certainly is a sin and a sin that these days is far too easily brushed off.

We only need turn on the TV, go to the cinema or even just walk around town to hear the Lord's name taken in vain or used as a curse word. This is a direct violation of the second commandment. People often say "I don't mean anything by it" ... but that's exactly what *in vain* means. What if people started using our name as a swear word? Every time they stubbed their toe, they shouted "Oh my John". We would wonder if people needed or wanted something, we would be sick of it. How much more disrespectful is it to call on the name of God, when rather than praying, what we are actually doing is expressing anger or shock or disgust.

St Paul tells us in his letter to the Philippians "That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven and on earth, and under the earth and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord". Many of us have gotten out of the habit of bowing our heads at the Holy Name, bring this beautiful tradition back! When you hear the Holy Name of Jesus, make an act of reverence. We cannot be responsible for the behaviour of others, we cannot control what they say, what we are responsible for is our own speech and behaviour. Let us always seek to honour God with our words and love Him in our hearts and never to grieve or offend Him with thoughtless talk.
