I just thought that I'd give you a little update on the meeting that the Vocations Promotion Team and the Bishop had last Sunday with men from across the Diocese who are considering a vocation to the Priesthood. You may remember that a few weeks ago in his pastoral letter for Good Shepherd Sunday, His Lordship invited any man who was listening to his words and wanted to find out more to come to this meeting that was held last week. We were absolutely delighted when just shy of 30 men tuned up aged from 16-35!! Obviously, these are very early stages, and it may become apparent that the priesthood is not for all of them, but, it is a very promising start to our work and bodes well for the future of the Diocese! – To that end, next week there will be a second collection for the Priest's Training Fund.

FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

The Feast of the Most Holy Trinity, which we celebrate today, invites all of us to enter deeply into the central mystery of our Christian faith: one God in three Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. This solemnity is not an invitation to unravel a theological puzzle or problem but to stand in awe of a God who has revealed Himself to us as a communion of life and love. We need not wonder what God is like, for He has made Himself known to us through creation, the life of Jesus, and the ongoing presence of the Holy Spirit. Trinity Sunday calls us to embrace this revelation and to live as reflections of God's Trinitarian love in our daily lives, becoming more and more like Him each day.

At the heart of the Trinity is the truth that God is love. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit exist in an eternal relationship of perfect unity and self-giving. The Father creates and loves; the Son, Jesus Christ, redeems us through His incarnation, death, and resurrection; and the Holy Spirit sanctifies us, drawing us into God's life. This dynamic communion is not distant or abstract but intimately close, for through baptism, we are incorporated into the very life of the Trinity. We are made children of the Father, brothers and sisters of the Son, and temples of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity reveals that God's essence is relational, and we are called to mirror this love in our relationships with one another through forgiveness, generosity, and unity.

The revelation of the Trinity assures us that God is not hidden. In the Old Testament, the Father spoke through prophets and covenants. In the New Testament, Jesus revealed the Father's heart, saying, "Whoever has seen me has seen the Father". At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit empowered the Church to carry this truth to all nations. Every moment of salvation history unveils God's desire to draw us into His love. For us, this feast is a reminder that our worship, especially in the Holy Mass, is a participation in the Trinitarian life. Each time we make the sign of the cross, we proclaim our faith in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, grounding our lives in this mystery.

St. Thomas Becket, the martyred Archbishop of Canterbury, deepened the Church's devotion to the Trinity by promoting its celebration in 1162, a legacy that inspires us to honour God's revealed nature. Trinity Sunday challenges us to live out this truth. Let us reflect God's love by serving the poor, welcoming the stranger, and building community. May we give thanks that God has not remained distant from us or hidden Himself away, but revealed Himself as Trinity, inviting us into His eternal communion of love, where we find our purpose and joy.
