FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

When we reflect on the deepest mysteries of our faith, it helps to approach them with simplicity. After all, the clearest explanation has already been given to us by the greatest Teacher of all, Christ Himself. We need only to look to the Gospels and listen to His own words.

Consider the mystery of the Eucharist, the profound gift of Christ offering His Body and Blood to us under the outward signs of bread and wine. What does Jesus actually say? "This is My Body. This is My Blood." He doesn't say it represents His Body, or that it's a symbol of His Blood. He speaks plainly: "This is My Body. This is My Blood."

What we receive in the Eucharist is not a portion or fragment of Christ. He doesn't say, "Here is part of My Body" or "a few drops of My Blood." No, the gift is complete. Even the smallest particle of the consecrated Host is the whole Christ. That's why the Church is so careful with the Eucharist. Every crumb contains the fullness of Christ Himself.

We know that when someone's body is separated from their blood, they die. But as St. Paul tells us, "Christ, once raised from the dead, dies no more" (Romans 6:9). His Body and Blood can no longer be divided. So when He says, "This is My Body," we understand it to be both His Body and Blood. The same is true for the chalice. Both His Blood and His Body are truly present.

Christ chose to be present under the distinct forms of bread and wine to recall the moment of His sacrifice on the Cross, when His Body and Blood were truly separated. In every Mass, that moment is made present to us, not as a repetition, but as a re-presentation of His one saving act. Yet what we receive is not a lifeless Christ, but the living Lord, risen, glorified, and fully present.

This means we can be even closer to Jesus now than those who walked with Him during His earthly ministry. It's tempting to envy the disciples who saw Him with their own eyes, but through the Blessed Sacrament, we too can encounter Christ, not just in memory, but in reality.

If you truly desire to make Jesus the centre of your life, let the Eucharist be at the heart of it. This Sunday, consider joining the Corpus Christi procession as Christ is honoured and carried aloft. Let the Mass become the cornerstone of your week, or even of your daily rhythm if possible. Prepare yourself with reverence. Genuflect when you enter the church, spend a few moments in silent prayer before Mass, and receive Communion with careful devotion. Linger afterward in thanksgiving, acknowledging the tremendous grace you've just received.

And when the final blessing sends us forth, we should already be yearning to return, not just to the building, but to Christ Himself. Because if our hearts are attuned to meeting Him here, we won't miss Him when He appears in unexpected ways: in the face of someone in need, in the hour of our death, or when He returns in glory to judge the world.
