FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

This week in the liturgical calendar, the Church keeps the memory of St Philip Neri often called the "Apostle of Rome." Known for his infectious humour and deep spirituality, St Philip's life reveals how fidelity to the Church's traditions can radiate joy, drawing souls closer to Christ.

Born in Florence, Philip abandoned worldly prospects to serve God in Rome, where he was ordained a priest at the age of 36. His ministry was rooted in the timeless traditions of the Church; prayer, the Sacraments, and devotion to the Blessed Eucharist. Yet, he infused these practices with a contagious joy that made his holiness approachable. St Philip's Oratory, a community of priests and laypeople, gathered regularly for prayer, music, and spiritual discussions, blended the solemnity of tradition with a lively, communal spirit. His Oratorian approach wasn't 'rigid', it was a celebration of faith that invited everyone, from the nobles of Rome to the poorest of the poor, to encounter God's love.

St Philip's joy wasn't superficial either. It sprang from his deep trust in divine providence and his adherence to the Church's teachings. He cherished the Mass, often experiencing ecstasies during its celebration, and encouraged frequent confession, believing these Sacraments were wellsprings of grace. His famous quips and playful antics, like assigning humorous penances or shaving half his beard to humble himself, disarmed his critics, making the Gospel's truth accessible. This balance of reverence for tradition and a light-hearted spirit showed that holiness need not be dour and miserable but can be a joyful adventure. Tradition, for St Philip, was not a relic but a living force. He drew on the Church's ancient practices, liturgy, catechesis, and devotion to the saints—while adapting them to the needs of 16th century Rome. His evening gatherings, filled with music and laughter, echoed the early Christian feasts, proving that tradition could evolve without losing its essence. This joyful fidelity attracted countless souls, including future saints, and helped renew a Church facing the challenges of the so called 'reformation'.

Today, St Philip Neri reminds us that tradition and joy are inseparable. By embracing the Church's timeless truths with a heart full of gladness, we can live as he did—rooted in faith, radiant with hope, and alive with love. His life challenges us to make our parish a vibrant centre of worship and community, where tradition sparks joy and draws others to Christ.
