FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

I don't know about you, but Monsignor Smith and I have been absolutely glued to Celebrity Traitors. I think it's the blend of secrecy, suspense and funny characters that make it so compelling. If you haven't seen it (what have you been doing?) the celebrity contestants must work together to achieve a shared goal of winning money for charity but among them are the few "traitors" who secretly work against the rest. Around the round table, accusations fly, theories are tested and the truth eventually comes to light, even if it has to be dragged out.

It makes for gripping viewing but perhaps it also says something about the human heart. In each of us there is a struggle between light and shade, faithfulness and betrayal. The story of our salvation is full of such moments, Adam and Eve's first act of distrust in the garden, Judas' betrayal of Our Lord, Peter's threefold denial. Yet even in our weakness, God's mercy never fails. Jesus looks upon the sinner not with condemnation but with compassion. He restores the fallen and invites us back into friendship with Him. Unlike The Traitors, where exposure leads to expulsion, in the Gospel exposure leads to healing. When the light of Christ shines upon us, our hidden faults and failures are revealed and laid bare, not to shame us, but to set us free. What we conceal in fear, God transforms in love.

This November, as we celebrate the Feast of All Saints and pray for the Holy Souls, we are reminded that the goal of every Christian life is faithfulness. To remain true to Christ through all the trials and temptations of this world. The Saints were not perfect but they were honest before God. They lived without masks, allowing grace to purify what was weak and selfish within them. When we pray for the dead, we entrust them to that same mercy. We ask that whatever "treacherous" parts of the heart remain may be burned away in the fire of divine love, so that every soul may one day stand among the faithful in Heaven.

Perhaps that is what draws so many to the programme in the first place, not simply the drama of deceit, but the yearning for truth, belonging and trust. Beneath all the scheming and suspicion lies a deep human desire to be known and still loved. The Saints and Holy Souls remind us that this longing finds its true fulfilment in God alone, who knows us completely and loves us without condition. In His presence there is no need for disguise, no fear of exposure. The Lord sees us as we are and in His mercy, makes us what we are called to be, faithful, free and fully alive in His love.

So as we watch the series finale next week, we might quietly ask ourselves, where do I need to be made more faithful? Where is Christ calling me to deeper truth and trust? Because in the end, the greatest victory is not to deceive or survive but to be transformed, to become, by God's grace, truly faithful.
