#### **FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST**

There's been a lot of talk lately about artificial intelligence and a future where machines do all the work for us. Some people see this as a dream come true, a world where we no longer have to strive for anything, where we can rest and enjoy life without the burdens of employment. But is that really as appealing as it sounds?

It's true that many jobs can be tiring, repetitive, and not always fulfilling. But as Catholics, we're called to see work differently. In Genesis, God gave man the task of cultivating the earth and caring for creation. Work wasn't a punishment but a gift, something that allows us to participate in God's plan and ongoing care for the world. Pope St John Paul II once wrote that the value of work doesn't come from what is being done, but rather, from the fact that it is a human being doing it. Even the most ordinary tasks can be filled with meaning when done with love, care and a spirit of service. Whether it's a farmer in the field, a parent raising children, or a cashier at the checkout, all work has dignity when it reflects our shared call to serve one another.

It's also worth remembering that rest is holy too. God rested on the seventh day, not out of tiredness but to enjoy what had been made. Rest isn't just free time, it's time set aside to appreciate, to give thanks and to rejoice in the goodness of life. Sunday, as our day of rest, reminds us of this sacred rhythm of work and worship. Even in retirement, many people find themselves drawn back to work of some kind, volunteering, caring for grandchildren, or even returning to a previous role. This isn't always about money, it's about purpose, connection, and the desire to contribute. Our need to work runs deeper than just economics.

As we navigate a changing world, let us not be too quick to dismiss the value of work. Technology may make life easier, but it should never rob us of the deep satisfaction that comes from a job well done. Let us pray that in every task, big or small, we may find purpose, dignity and a chance to grow in love.
