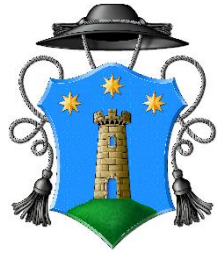

We have received a quote to replace the hall door and surrounding windows with something more modern and durable, £1800. ### **FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST**

As we celebrate the Feast of Jesus Christ the Eternal High Priest this week, it's a good time to reflect on the profound mystery of Christ's priesthood and its enduring significance in our lives. This feast, rooted in the Letter to the Hebrews, reminds us that Jesus is the eternal high priest who, through His life, death, and resurrection, offered the perfect sacrifice for our salvation. Unlike the priests of the Old Covenant, who offered repeated animal sacrifices, Christ's priesthood is eternal, singular, and complete. He is both the priest and the victim, offering Himself once for all to reconcile humanity with God. This feast calls us to contemplate how Christ's priesthood continues to shape the Church and, in a particular way, the lives of those called to share in His priestly ministry.

This Sunday, the meeting will take place between the Bishop and young men from across the diocese who are considering a call to the priesthood. It is a moment to listen, pray, and discern how the Holy Spirit is stirring their hearts to serve the Church. To those attending, please know that the entire diocesan community holds you in prayer as you courageously consider this sacred call.

What is a priest? A priest is a man called by God to act *in persona Christi capitis* in the person of Christ, the Head of the Church. Through the sacrament of Holy Orders, a priest is configured to Christ in a unique way, enabling him to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, forgive sins in the sacrament of Confession and shepherd God's people with love. Priests are not merely functionaries or social workers they are men set apart to bridge the divine and human, bringing God's grace to His people and lifting the prayers and needs of the faithful to God. In every Mass, the priest makes present Christ's eternal sacrifice, renewing the mystery of our redemption. In every act of service, whether preaching, counselling, or anointing the sick the priest should reflect Christ's self-giving love.

Priests share in the priesthood of Christ by participating in His mission to sanctify, teach, and govern the People of God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that the ministerial priesthood is at the service of the common priesthood of all the baptised. While all Christians are called to offer their lives as a "living sacrifice", ordained priests are entrusted with the sacred duty of leading the community in worship and guiding them toward holiness. This participation in Christ's priesthood is not about some kind of personal privilege but about humble service, mirroring Jesus, who "came not to be served but to serve".

This week, let us keep the men who will meet the Bishop in our prayers, asking that they might have the courage to hear the still small voice of God in their hearts amid this modern and often chaotic world. May this feast inspire all of us to pray for our priests and for vocations, that more men may respond generously to Christ's call. Let us give thanks for the gift of the priesthood, through which Our Lord's saving work continues in our midst.
