#### FROM YOUR PARISH PRIEST

Each year on Remembrance Sunday, we pause as a nation to honour those who gave their lives in war, men and women who laid down their lives in the service of others. At Mass, we do more than simply remember them, however, we pray for them. We commend their souls to God's mercy and give thanks for their courage, sacrifice and love.

Prayer for the dead is a deeply important act of charity. We believe that our prayers assist the departed as they are purified and drawn into the perfect love of God. When we stand in silence at 11:00am or whisper a prayer for a fallen soldier, we are doing something profoundly Christian, uniting the living and the dead and entrusting them to the Lord who is both the judge of nations and the healer of hearts.

Our remembrance is never about glorifying war. We know too well the terrible cost of human conflict. Yet, amid that suffering, we can still honour the courage, loyalty, and self-sacrifice of those who served. Many went to their deaths not out of hatred, but out of love, love for comrades, for family, for home and for the freedom of others. Our Lord said, "Greater love has no man than to lay down his life for his friends". That love, expressed even in the tragedy of war, points us to the Cross, where Christ's own self-giving brought peace and reconciliation to the whole world.

This day also invites us to reflect on the Christian virtue of patriotism. St Thomas Aquinas teaches that patriotism is not merely an emotion or sentiment, it is an aspect of justice, the virtue by which we give to others what is their due. In the *Summa Theologiae*, Aquinas places "piety", the honour and duty owed to one's parents and one's country, as a part of justice itself. Just as we honour our parents because they gave us life, so too we honour our homeland because it has nourished, protected and formed us.

For Aquinas, this love of country is not opposed to our love of God or of the universal human family. On the contrary, it is an ordered love. We first learn love, responsibility and service in the smaller circles of family and homeland and from there we are called to extend that same charity to the whole world. Patriotism, rightly understood, helps us to love concretely, beginning where God has placed us.

True patriotism then is not blind nationalism. It is a grateful and responsible love, gratitude for the blessings we have received and a sense of duty to promote the common good, defend what is right and work for peace and justice. The true patriot seeks not domination but righteousness, a country that reflects the values of Christ's Gospel and contributes to the good of all. So, this Remembrance Sunday, as we honour the war dead, let us also renew our Christian vocation to be peacemakers and faithful citizens. Let us pray for those who have died in battle, for those who still suffer from war and for the peace that only Christ can bring.
